

Welcome to Albania

Albania is a vibrant and fast-developing country in Southeast Europe, known for its rich history, natural beauty, and warm hospitality. Strategically located on the Adriatic and Ionian Seas, Albania is becoming an increasingly important player in regional cooperation, tourism, agriculture, and renewable energy.

The country is recognized for its ancient heritage, including archaeological sites, Ottoman-era towns, and well-preserved traditions. Albania is also a candidate country for the European Union and has made significant strides in aligning its policies with EU standards.

Albania boasts some of Europe's most stunning natural landscapes — from the Albanian Alps to pristine beaches along the Riviera — and is one of the most biodiverse countries in the region.







Population and Urban Life

Albania has a population of around 2.75 million. The capital city, Tirana, is home to approximately 900,000 people and serves as the country's political, economic, and cultural center. Other major cities include Durrës, Shkodër, Vlorë, and Elbasan.

Although many Albanians live in urban areas, a significant portion of the population still resides in smaller towns and rural villages, preserving traditional ways of life.

A Multilingual Heritage

The official language of Albania is Albanian, which has two main dialects: Gheg in the north and Tosk in the south. Although Albanian is spoken nationwide, the country also hosts linguistic including Greek, minorities, Macedonian, Aromanian, Romani, and Serbian speakers, in certain regions.

Albania's rich cultural diversity reflects centuries of interaction with Illyrian, Roman, Byzantine, Western Ottoman, and civilizations— European influences that are evident in its architecture, traditions, music, and cuisine.




Between Mountains and the Sea

Albania is located in Southeastern Europe, on the western Balkan Peninsula, bordered by Montenegro, Kosovo, North Macedonia, and Greece, with a long coastline along the Adriatic and Ionian Seas.


With over 450 kilometers of coastline, Albania is known for its stunning beaches, crystal-clear waters, and growing reputation as a Mediterranean tourist destination. The country also features a mountainous interior, with Albanian Alps in the north and highlands in the southeast.

The average altitude is around 700 meters, and the highest peak is Mount Korab, standing at 2,764 meters, located on the border with North Macedonia.

Activactions

Tirana offers a rich mix of attractions, ranging from historic landmarks and museums to vibrant street life, modern galleries, and natural escapes. The city is a cultural hub where Ottoman, Italian, and communist-era influences coexist with modern Albanian identity.

For history lovers, must-see sites include the Et'hem Bey Mosque, the Clock Tower, and the House of Leaves — a museum dedicated to Albania's secret surveillance history. Art enthusiasts can enjoy both classical and contemporary collections at the National Gallery of Arts and the Center for Openness and Dialogue (COD) at the Prime Minister's Office. Tirana is also home to BUNK'ART, a unique underground museum complex built in a Cold War-era nuclear bunker, showcasing Albania's recent past.

For those who enjoy nature and leisure, the Grand Park of Tirana offers expansive green spaces, a lake, and open-air cafes. Just 15 minutes from the city center, Mount Dajti National Park is accessible by cable car, offering hiking, biking, and panoramic views of the city and beyond.







Attractions

Sports fans can attend matches by KF Tirana or Partizani, or explore recreational options like cycling routes, climbing, and seasonal skiing in Dajti during winter months.

Whether you're into culture, cuisine, nature, or nightlife, Tirana provides an engaging and unexpected blend of experiences for all visitors.

For food lovers, Tirana's culinary scene is a flavorful journey through Mediterranean, Balkan, and Ottoman traditions, with a growing presence of international cuisine. From lively street food spots serving byrek and qofte to elegant restaurants offering locally-sourced dishes and Albanian wines, the city is a delight for the palate.

Tirana's nightlife is vibrant and youthful, with lively bars, music venues, and late-night cafés concentrated around areas like Blloku, once a restricted zone for communist elites, now a trendy district for entertainment and dining.

With its welcoming atmosphere, walkable center, and dynamic blend of old and new, Tirana is more than just the political capital — it's the beating heart of modern Albania and a gateway to its cultural and natural treasures.







Weather in November in Albania

November in Albania marks the transition from autumn to winter, bringing cooler temperatures and increased rainfall. Average daytime temperatures range from 10 to 18°C along the coast, while inland and mountainous areas can be significantly colder, sometimes dropping close to freezing at night. Rain showers are frequent, especially in the northern and central regions, making November one of the wettest months of the year. Despite the changing weather, the landscape remains beautiful, with autumn colors still visible in many areas before winter fully sets in.

Visitors are advised to dress appropriately, and a raincoat or umbrella is recommended.





By taxi or hotel shuttle (EUR35 round trip; approx. 13km, ~30 min).

Alternatively, take a taxi directly to Skanderbeg Square—tell the driver "Maritim Plaza Hotel Tirana".

From Train or Bus Station

It's a 5-minute walk to Skanderbeg Square.

Exit stations toward the city center and head for the square; the hotel is located right on the main plaza.

Public Transport - Nearby Bus Lines

Several local bus routes stop near Skanderbeg Square:

Bus T2 (Airport ↔ City Center)

Bus 4, 5, 6, 7, 10 (various city lines) stop within a few minutes' walk.








